Course Description: Word is the most powerful and popular word processing programs in business today. As a communication tool, it excels at formatting and communicating information. But the tools of Word far exceed the capabilities we expect from a word processing program. In this course we are going to address some of these advanced features that will enable to you stand out from the crowd. These skills will provide you with a new level of competency including Borders and Shading, Multilevel lists, Footnotes, and collaboration tools like Hyperlinks and webpages. Students taking this course are assumed to have a basic knowledge of Word (Word 1 – Beginning) and functionality (Word 2 – Intermediate) and access to Microsoft Word 2011 or later on either platform.

Note: This course does not provide direct instructor contact; assignments are included in the course to help students process the information learned and will not be evaluated by the instructor.

Required Texts and Course Materials: There is no required book for this course. Relevant online resources that support the course content and encourage further investigation will be available throughout the course assignments. Active hyperlinks are utilized throughout the course and will link to the appropriate information when clicked. These include videos, podcasts, worksheets, online activities, journal articles and other resources.
