Course Requirements for each of these two graduate-level courses: Courses have two different numbers so that teachers may take two courses. The curricular project for each course must vary and be approved by instructors. If you have a large project it is appropriate to divide your project into 2 parts.

Ex: If you are creating a series of powerpoint or lecture notes for a high school course you can

say project 1 chapters 1-5. Project 2 chapters 6-10.

Ex: Primary teachers may need to divide their project up differently such as project 1 creating file folder games in mathematics. Project 2 creating file folder games for language arts.

In order to receive credit (three graduate level semester units) for each of the above courses, participants must:

- \*Complete all necessary registration forms and pay applicable fees \*Submit a written statement of objectives for the courses
- \*Submit a written log of hours per course. Your log of hours should include 30 hours of "homework". The whole course would take approximately 50 hours but the log only needs to document 30 hours of work you do such as typing, searching for materials online or reading etc. These requirements are per course and so if you are taking 2 courses the total would be double.
- \*Present final project to the instructor (on-line) demonstrating how the implementation of this curriculum will address appropriate standards (i.e. California Content Standards, Common Core

Standards, California Standards for the Teaching Profession, national or local standards), ensure and assess student learning

## **Evaluation and Grading**

All students completing the above mentioned course requirements will be given a letter grade based upon the following components:

- \*Instructors will review submitted written objectives and confer individually as needed for clarification
- \*Instructors will monitor student work and progress during class sessions. Instructors will be available online to assist and dialog with students
- \*Instructors will review written log of outside lab hours submitted at the end of the course (not later than 6 months from registration date).
- \*Instructor will evaluate the student's final project and provide feedback.

Note: Upon completion of all above mentioned course requirements instructors will issue a letter grade.
